- 2. Correlate anterior, lateral, inferior and posterior MI's with related coronary artery and name one EKG change associated.
- 3. Compare and contrast ischemic changes versus injury/infarction changes on EKG.
- 4. Describe Wellen's Syndrome and the clinical significance of this finding.
- 5. Differentiate EKG changes indicative of an old MI from that of a recent MI.
- 6. Explain troponin.
- 7. Name 2 criteria in the identification of a Right Ventricular MI.
- 8. Describe the 18-Lead EKG as well as describe rationale for use.
- 9. Identify right and left Bundle Branch Block patterns.
